Ridership Report	 Demand Response DR is up an estimated 42% from last year. We are now averaging 179 trips per day: 895 trips per week. Precovid numbers were approximately 620 trips per day, 3,100 per week. The majority of riders are still going to work, but we have seen an increase in our DDA transports as restrictions have been lifted. Employment is approx. 45% of our ridership, DDA is approx. 25%. New TrailBlazer: Since we do not have the actual ridership from September yet, September was calculated using the average of the previous two months. West Blk2, West Purple 2, and the NC Commuter were not in service until January 2021. West Purple 2 and Red Commuter did not run all of QTR 1 in FY21- they are temporarily suspended due to low ridership. They are still currently suspended, and we have had less than a handful of requests for both routes combined since suspending service. Even with medical buildings opening for in person appointments, we have not seen a significant increase in ridership to those stops. NC Orange is showing a decrease in ridership, but What was one route in FY 21 is now split into two routes. So, combined, we have increased ridership by 56%. TDP: nothing new to report
County Report	 Received pre-award grants for FY22 which includes 3 replacement vehicles. No decrease in funding In the early stages of researching new software FY21 awarded bus replacements arrived and are in use. Still awaiting the final 3 Ford Transits. Future order of buses may take more time to arrive due to microchip shortages
