Lorna Rice	Lorna Rice requested approval of the September 2015 minutes as submitted. Lorna motioned 1st and Jan Flora 2nd for approval. All were in favor to approve as submitted.
Guest Speaker – John H. Staehlin	Bob Coen introduced the guest speaker Mr. John Staehlin. Mr. Staehlin started Volunteers for Medical Engineering (VME) in 1982. VME merged with Learning Independence through Computers (LINC) to become V-LINC in 2010.
	Mr. Staehlin is a mechanical engineer and inventor who worked at Westinghouse for 37 years. After 7 years in retirement he went back to work for Northrop Grumman for another 7 years. While at Westinghouse Mr. Staehlin turned in over 400 invention disclosures and 30 patents. During this time Mr. Staehlin created Volunteers for Medical Engineering (VME) to design devices for individuals with disabilities. VME is a nonprofit located at the Workforce and Technology Center in Baltimore. Mr. Staehlin had a PowerPoint presentation that included images of individuals the organization helped and the devices they created for them. The devices included (many more were shown): a mechanism that opened and closed two fingers using EKG patches on muscles; adapted a toy jeep steering wheel for a child without forearms; added a door to a crib to help a client get child in/out of crib; a metronome wheelchair swing; adapted a trombone;, steps for getting in/out of an SUV; a computerized weaving system; stovetop device to hold pan in place for individuals with one arm; an easel that rotates/tilts for an artist; an adapted stroller. While on the Governors Committee for Camden Yards they designed folding seating that has been used in 50% of stadiums in the US.
